CALL TO ORDER

Welcome

The Chair welcomed members.

Approval of Minutes

The minutes from August 2021 were provided to Board members via electronic mail.

The Chair called for a motion of approval. Ms. DeKay moved approval; Mr. Long seconded; Motion carried.

FINANCIAL

Management and Administration

Staff reported:

• <u>Finance Report</u> Staff presented the finance report for July 2021. The July report shows the budgeted amounts for the new 2020-21 fiscal year. This includes \$60,834.00 for project funding. This will be the amount available for the project requests to be presented.

The Chair called for a motion of approval. Mr. Long moved approval; Mr. Taylor seconded; Motion carried.

- <u>COVID Surge</u>: Staff reported on the multiple state and local conference calls to assist with the coordination of resources and sharing challenges during the current hospital surge of COVID-19 patients. Because there is not a declared state of emergency, the normal emergency management structure is not activated. Coalitions statewide are working closely with the Florida Hospital Association (FHA) to identify issues and coordinate resources. The major issues encountered are the need for ICU bed placement, staffing shortages and the need for oxygen.
- <u>National Healthcare Coalition Preparedness Conference</u>: The HCC will sponsor Board members to attend. To date, Tom Moffses, Jim Lyons, and Jeff Taylor are interested in attending. Staff will wait until 10/1 to pay for the registration, the last day of the 'early bird' discount. Hopefully the surge should improve, and staff will verify that the conference will occur.
- <u>Bylaws Review</u>: Next month we will begin reviewing the Bylaws documents.
- <u>Virtual Training</u>: The training calendar was released early today. Staff asked for members to share the virtual training opportunities with co-workers.

BUSINESS

2021-22 Project Funding Process

The process:

- 1) All projects were required to be submitted to FDOH-State for their review and approval to determine grant eligibility. One project was not approved for HPP funding by FDOH. The Department has determined that local health departments are not eligible for HPP funding as they already receive preparedness funding.
- 2) After FDOH-State review, a team of independent reviewers scored each project based on their perceived needs of the region's healthcare system.
- 3) Project scores produced through independent review will be presented to the executive board for their consideration and to allocate funding.

2021-22Project Funding Priorities

Staff presented the project application summary spreadsheet provided to Board Members. The total amount requested through applications was \$45,345.29 and there is \$60,834.00 available.

Staff presented each project description, items to be purchased and the total amount requested. Board members discussed the requests and funding allocations.

Approval of Funding Awards

The Chair called for a vote by project:

Mr. Smith moved approval of partial funding for the Cross City project; Ms. DeKay seconded: Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Smith moved approval of full funding for the Dixie project; Mr. Long seconded: Motion Carried 4-1. Ms. DeKay moved approval of full funding for the CILNCF project: Mr. Long seconded: Motion carried unanimously.
