Welcome

The Chair welcomed members.

Approval of Minutes

FINANCIAL

Finance Report

• **2021-2022 Project Funding Update:** All projects are in process. All projects are on target and in the process of purchasing and reimbursement. The CILNCF Disability is approaching and will be reimbursed immediately afterward.

BUSINESS

New Members

Eleven (11) new member requests were presented for membership.

EMAG Conference – Follow-Up and Feedback

Staff reported how beneficial the conference was for them and fellow members. There was a large focus on healthcare throughout the conference, which provided opportunities for resources. The conference allowed for conversation across different Coalitions within the state and across the Federal Region 4. Staff encouraged members to consider attending the conference next year.

2022-2023 Project Funding Applications Released

Staff reported applications are open and due May 16 at noon. Applications must describe the project's alignments with the (HPP) and at least meet one of the four Health Care Preparedness & Response Capabilities. Preference is given to Regional projects and applications that align with specialty surge events. After the applications close, there will be a prioritization committee to review the projects and present them to the Boards. The Board will vote on the project applications.

Burn Surge Annex Draft

Attached to the meeting packet is the draft Alliance Burn Surge Annex developed by staff. Staff asked members to review and comment on the draft with their facilities by May 13. Final approval of the Burn Surge Annex will be in May.

Crisis Standards of Care Guidance – Review and Comment

Staff provided a draft of the Crisis Standards of Care Plan Guidance to the membership. This plan meets the Coalition ASPR requirement, the guidance is intended to help members and their facilities in their internal processes. Staff asked for review and comment of the draft by members and their facilities by May 13. Final approval of Crisis Standards of Care Plan Guidance will be in May.

Call for At-Large Board Member Nominations (Survey via email)

A survey will soon be sent to members. Staff encouraged members to nominate themselves or someone else to serve on the Board. Surveys are due back by May 11, and there will be a vote at the next meeting. Serving on the Board is a 2-year commitment, the term will begin in July of 2022. Tom Moffses will remain in Public Health.

TRAINING AND EXERCISE

Hospital Incident Command Training (5/19 Jacksonville & 5/24 Gainesville)

Last in-person training opportunity for the Fiscal Year. The flyer was sent out via email and is included in the April meeting packet.

Nursing Home Incident Command Training (5/20 Jacksonville & 5/23 Lake City)

Last in-person training opportunity for the Fiscal Year. The flyer was sent out via email and is included in the April meeting packet.

Virtual TTX Complete

Virtual and in-person TTX complete. The After Action Reports and certificates are to come soon to those who participated.

MRSE Exercise – June 23 (partnering with FCDC)

Partnering with First Coast Disaster Council (FCDC) in Jacksonville, the exercise is scheduled for June 23. The exercise asks for a surge of 20% of the staffed beds in the Region. Staff asked hospital members to look out for a survey that will be sent to them. This survey will ask for the hospital's current staffed capacity for bed types. Staff will use this data to build out the scenario for the exercise.

MEMBER REPORTS AND OPEN DISCUSSION

Hospitals – UF Health Gainesville provided a report on their experience with the FIDTN exercise; reported the exercise provided an opportunity to refine their hospital processes for dealing with a highly infectious disease. Mr. Spellman reported Alachua County Emergency Management is working on satellite phones, and UF Health Gainesville is trying to get the sat phones for certain units. More information to come.

Emergency Management – Nothing to report.

Public Health – Working with State leadership for statewide projects. Reports one project for mobile units for health departments is coming to fruition. The mobile units will be purchased by the State and will be sent to select county health departments. More information to come.

EMS – Reports Dixie County is experiencing D50 and D10 shortages, and local hospitals do not have supplies to spare.

Long-Term Care – Nothing to report.

Home Health – Nothing to report.

FDLE – Reports that with the upcoming Governor's Inauguration, there will be training in Tallahassee. Training offerings are open to anyone in the State. Description, times, and dates of training offerings are attached. Reported that FDLE will partner with DHS to perform physical security assessments at your facilities. After the assessment, they will provide improvement opportunities. For further information, contact Tommy Capobianco.
